Thank you for expressing an interest in writing for the Crisis Response Journal blog. Please note, these guides have been made as simple and as non-prescriptive as possible, because we do not like to constrain the creativity and natural writing style of our contributors. However, the editors reserve the right to change the copy, edit for sense and amend text to fit our house styles, as well as with regard to choice of illustrations, images, etc. The Editor's decision is always final in these instances.

- Blogs should be between 300 and 1,000 words
- Blogs should be provided in Word format
- Any URLs should be pasted in full in brackets in the text where you wish the links to appear
- Please do not include any footnotes, headers, formatting, etc
- No double spaces after words; please do not use tabs or spaces within the text
- No double returns for new paragraphs
- English spelling 's' instead of 'z' in most cases
- Please provide images as separate files (preferably JPEGs). High resolution images are preferred, and are essential if the blog is also to be used in the hard copy issue of CRJ
- Please provide author picture and biography
- Please provide captions and credits for photos, clearly indicating which photos they refer to.

Publishing in the CRJ is a collaborative experience and we work closely with our authors - we want you to be as happy as we are with the finished result, while creating text that is informative and useful, accurate, pleasant to read, and which looks attractive and distinctive on the page.
